

The U.S. EPA is proposing to make the most significant changes to Rodenticides in 15 years:

- Canceling products and uses
- Adding more requirements to the labels
- Reclassifying some products to Restricted Use Pesticides

Do you use rodenticides? Do you purchase, sell or distribute rodenticides? Are rodenticides essential to protect your home or business from rodent damage?

The EPA recently released for public comment the Proposed Interim Decisions (PIDs) for rodenticides. The deadline to comment is February 13. Please visit the Rodenticide Task Force website for details on the EPA's proposals and how to comment on the proposed changes for:

- Acute Rodenticides (bromethalin and cholecalciferol)
- Anticoagulant Rodenticides (chlorophacinone, diphacinone, warfarin, brodifacoum, bromadiolone, difenacoum, and difethialone)
- Zinc phosphide.
